

Request to Quarantine – Australian Parliament House (APH) Closed Circuit Television Footage

Unless directed by law, the Department of Parliamentary Services (DPS) on behalf of the Presiding Officers can refuse the quarantining of APH CCTV footage (video or images) that is not in accordance with the <u>APH CCTV Code of Practice</u> (the CCTV Code) statement of purpose or engages parliamentary privilege.

Sufficient detail should be included in the request to enable an appropriate assessment to be made by the Presiding Officers, or delegate, in accordance with the CCTV Code.

Approval for CCTV footage to be quarantined does not provide approval for the viewing or release of the quarantined footage. In order to view or release quarantined footage a 'Request to View or Release' form is to be completed.

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

Description of incident

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 01:50 hrs:

- Two staff members, a Bruce Lehrmann (male) and Brittany Higgins (female) of Minister Reynold's Office, entered APH through Point 8. The members were not in possession of their APH passes. PSS Officers Fairweather positively identified them as passholders and issued temporary passes. They stated to PSS Officers Fairweather and Anderson that they had urgent business to attend to.
- PSS Officers Fairweather and Anderson made the observation that the female person appeared to be affected by alcohol and stumbled when passing through the screening point.
- PSS Officer Anderson then escorted the two passholders to Suite M1-23 where the PSOR then remotely unlocked the suite for the passholders to access.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 02:35 hrs:

- The male passholder exited APH through point 8 and appeared to be in a hurry. When asked if he was coming back he quickly replied "no".
- The PSS Officers observed that he was not accompanied by the female passholder that entered with him.
- Officer Fairweather advised the Team Leader of the situation and concerns for the female passholder and requested that a welfare be conducted as soon as possible to confirm everything was alright.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 04:15 hrs:

Female PSS Officer Anderson attended the suite M1-23 and observed that it was unlocked.
 PSS Officer Anderson entered the suite to undertake an occupancy check before securing the suite. Officer Anderson checked the door to the Minister's Office and found it unlocked.
 Officer Anderson knocked on the door and then entered.

- Officer Anderson observed the female passholder on the lounge undressed. The female passholder opened her eyes and acknowledged Officer Anderson. Officer Anderson assessed that the person was alright and conscious she exited the ministerial suite.
- Officer Anderson advised the Team Leader of the situation, who asked if the female was alright, and Officer Anderson advised 'yes'.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 07:15 hrs the matter was reported to the Director Security Operations (DSO) who was advised that the female passholder had not exited APH and was therefore presumed to still be in the suite. The DSO instructed the PSS Team Leader to undertake a welfare check of the female passholder.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 08:33 hrs the DSO reported this matter to the DPS Chief of Staff, Leanne Tunningley. Leanne Tunningley reported to the matter to the Deputy Secretary, Cate Saunders, who subsequently advised the DPS Secretary.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 08:59 hrs the DSO reported this matter to the Ministerial Liaison Manager, Stephen Frost.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 09:15 hrs PSS Team Leader Allan Tyler and female PSS Officer Kristine Brenton attended the ministerial suite and Officer Brenton entered. Officer Brenton had a conversation with the female passholder through a closed door where the passholder indicated that "everything was ok".

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 10.02 hrs the female staff member exited point 8.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 10.09 hrs the Deputy Secretary and DPS Chief of Staff arrived at APH to follow up on the welfare the member on the advice of the Secretary. At this point the Deputy Secretary was advised of the welfare check that had occurred at 9.15 that indicated that the member was 'ok'.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 11.00 hrs at the request of the Deputy Secretary the PSS Team Leader obtained the Parliament House Visitor Pass Register to enable the identification of the members. At this point it was identified that the female passholder had signed out.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 11.10 hrs the PSS Team Leader checked identified that the with the PSOR as to the security status of suite M1-23 and it was identified that the suite had been left unsecured. A PSS Officer attended suite M1-23 at 11:15 hrs and confirmed that it was vacant. The Officer arranged for the PSOR to secure the suite.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 12.40 hrs the Ministerial Liaison Manager (Stephen Frost) contacted the Director Security Operations and requested that the Ministerial Office be cleaned. The MLM gave the DSO approval via email to Leanne Tunningley for cleaning staff to enter the Minister's Office to undertake the cleaning. The First Assistant Secretary Building Services was contacted and arranged for cleaners to clean the Minister's Office.

On 23 March 2019 at approximately 16.00 hrs a senior APH cleaner attended suite M1-23 and cleaned the Minister's Office.

Due to the sensitivity of this matter the Team Leaders involved were instructed not to discuss this matter further with any staff. Reports have also been obtained from the officers involved.

To whom it may concern

On the 23 March 2019 at approximately 0150, two staff from Minister Reynold's office (M1-23) came in through Point 8 and requested (Positively Identified) green passes as they had forgotten theirs

I PSS Officer Mark Fairweather then asked for identification which they both produced before I could issue their passes (34644) and (25396)

I observed that the female may have been affected by alcohol as she stumbled whilst trying to selfclear through the Walk through Metal Detector

I then asked Nicola Anderson (Foxtrot 4) who was in the area could she escort the two pass holders to the suite

I then called the PSOR and informed them of the pass numbers, and that there would be an entry into the suite

At approximately 0230 the male pass holder exited (alone) through Point 8 in a hurry and dropped off his pass. I asked him if he was coming back. He didn't stop and hastily replied "NO"

Straight after this I contacted Kevin Callan (Security 3) and I formed him of the situation and my concerns of the welfare of the female pass holder

On the 23 March 2019 at approximately 0240, I Kevin Callan (Security 3) Night shift was informed by PSS Officer Mark Fairweather that he had some concerns about a female pass holder who had entered though Point 8 earlier and had not left with the other pass holder. The Minister's suite was (M1-23)

Mark explained the situation to me on what had happened

I contacted PSS Officer Nikola Anderson (Foxtrot 4), and asked could she do a welfare check as soon as possible, to see if everything was alright

At approximately 0420 Nikola called and informed me that she had entered the suite. (Nikola's statement of events are attached to this email)

I asked Nicola was the female alright. Nikola replied "Yes"

In the morning handover I informed Alan Tyler (Security 3) Day shift of the situation

At Approximately 01:50am on the 23/03/2019 I unlocked Ministerial suite (1-23) for a male and a female pass holder who advised Mark Fairweather and me that they had urgent business that needed tending to. Upon their arrival both Mark Fairweather and I observed that the female was intoxicated.

The male pass holder left at approximately 02:30 on his own. Mark Fairweather who witnessed the male leave notified the team leader on duty Kevin Callan of his hastily departure. Kevin rang me and advised me to carry out a welfare check on the female pass holder if she hadn't left by the time M. Fairweather returned from his break.

At approximately 04:15am I went to Ministerial suite (1-23) to carry out the welfare check on the female pass holder.

I entered the suite and announced myself loudly. All the lights in the suite were off and I noticed that the door leading into the Minister's office was closed. I announced myself again loudly as I opened the Minister's office door.

I found the female pass holder asleep on the Ministers lounge naked and in the fetal position. She had heard me come in as she opened her eyes and rolled over on to her side. Upon realising she was alright and conscious; I backed out of the office, closed the door behind me and vacated the suite. I then called Kevin Callan and notified him of what I had witnessed.

On 3 April 2019, Australian Federal Police Protection Liaison (AFP PL) submitted a request to view APH CCTV footage of an incident in the Ministerial Wing between 22:30 on 22 March 2019 and 12:00 on Saturday 23 March 2019 (Attachment A). AFP PL is seeking to view the CCTV footage to conduct initial review of the incident.

The CCTV footage relevant to this request was quarantined on 4 April 2019 and has been retained in accordance with section 10.3 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice.

This submission seeks your approval for the viewing of relevant footage by AFP PL in accordance with sections 11.2 and 11.4 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice.

Considerations

The request for the release and/or viewing of CCTV footage has been made in accordance with section 11.2 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice, which states:

PO Sub 2019/026 - Request by the Australian Federal Police Protection Liaison to view Australian Parliament House Closed Circuit Television footage of an incident in the Ministerial Wing

The viewing or release of footage to any person other than an Authorised Officer will require approval by the Presiding Officers or their nominated delegate.

The request is made in accordance with the APH CCTV Code of Practice Statement of Purpose sections 5.2.c and 5.2.d, which states the authorised purposes that CCTV can be used for are:

c. to prevent, deter, disrupt, or detect crime, criminal damage, vandalism or public disorder

d. to assist in identifying, apprehending and where appropriate, prosecuting offenders in relation to criminality

Under section 11.3 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice, DPS Assistant Secretary, Security Branch has been delegated authority to approve the release of CCTV footage where the release of footage is in response to an official request from law enforcement. This authority does not apply where the request engages parliamentary privilege.

As the requested APH CCTV footage potentially engages parliamentary privilege, your approval is sought under section 11.4 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice, which states:

In relation to the release of CCTV footage for any other purpose, or where the footage may engage parliamentary privilege, approval must be sought in writing from the Presiding Officers.

At this time AFP PL are only seeking to view relevant APH CCTV footage, as this mitigates the potential for APH CCTV footage being released into the public domain in the event of judicial proceedings.

On 9 April 2019 at approximately 10.30am, I spoke with Sergeant Paul Sherring, AFP Protection Liaison Parliament House, to seek further information regarding reasons for the request. Sergeant Sherring stated that he and Officer Rebecca Cleaves are seeking to primarily quarantine the footage so that it would not be lost in the event of a future investigation. Secondly, they proposed viewing the footage for "operational awareness" which was clarified as meaning to establish a "framepoint of the individuals entering the building as to their state of mind". Sergeant Sherring said the viewing was not for the purposes of a formal investigation nor for evidence gathering purposes. He indicated that based on what they viewed, it may help inform options for the female involved in respect of any future action. Sergeant Sherring confirmed however that they would not be conveying what they observe to the female involved.

On 3 April 2019, Australian Federal Police Protection Liaison (AFP PL) submitted a request to view APH CCTV footage of an incident in the Ministerial Wing between 22:30 on 22 March 2019 and 12:00 on Saturday 23 March 2019 (Attachment A). AFP PL is seeking to view the CCTV footage to conduct initial review of the incident.

The CCTV footage relevant to this request was quarantined on 4 April 2019 and has been retained in accordance with section 10.3 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice.

This submission seeks your approval for the viewing of relevant footage by AFPPL in accordance with sections 11.2 and 11.4 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice.

Considerations

The request for the release and/or viewing of CCTV footage has been made in accordance with section 12.2 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice, which states:

PO Sub 2019/076 - Request by the Australian Federal Police Protection Dalson to view Australian Parliament House Closed Circult Television footage of an incident in the Ministerial Wing

The viewing or release of footage to any person other than an Authorised Officer will require approval by the Presiding Officers or their nominated delegate.

The request is made in accordance with the APH CCTV Code of Practice Statement of Purpose sections-5.2.c and 5.2.d, which states the authorised purposes that CCTV can be used for are:

c. to prevent, deter, disrupt, or detect crime, criminal damage, vandalism or public disorder

d. to assist in identifying, apprehending and where appropriate, prosecuting offenders in relation to criminality

Under section 11.3 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice, DPS Assistant Secretary, Security Branch has been delegated authority to approve the release of CCTV footage where the release of footage is in response to an official request from law enforcement. This authority does not apply where the request engages parliamentary privilege.

As the requested APH CCTV footage potentially engages parliamentary privilege, your approval is sought under section 11.4 of the APH CCTV Code of Practice, which states:

In relation to the release of CCTV footage for any other purpose, or where the footage may engage parliamentary privilege, approval must be sought in writing from the Presiding Officers.

At this time AFP PL are only seeking to view relevant APH-CCTV footage, as this mitigates the potential for APH-CCTV footage being released into the public domain in the event of judicial proceedings

On 9 April 2019 at approximately 10.30am, I spoke with Sergeant Paul Sherring, AFP Protection Liaison Parliament House, to seek further information regarding reasons for the request. Sergeant Sherring stated that he and Officer Rebecca Cleaves are seeking to primarily quarantine the footage so that it would not be jost in the event of a future investigation. Secondly, they proposed viewing the footage for "operational awareness" which was clarified as meaning to establish a "framepoint of the individuals entering the building as to their state of mind". Sergeant Sherring said the viewing was not for the purposes of a formal investigation nor for evidence gathering purposes. He indicated that based on what they viewed, it may help inform options for the female involved in respect of any future action. Sergeant Sherring confirmed however that they would not be conveying what they observe to the female involved.



Dear Senior Constable Harman

I refer to your request for Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) footage in respect of an incident that occurred in the Australian Parliament House (APH) Ministerial Wing on 23 March 2019.

I note the request from the Australian Federal Police (AFP) for a copy of the footage is according to the AFP submission due to a fear that "should this not be obtained and the complainant wish to proceed in the future, a crucial piece of evidence to the investigation would be lost." I respectfully indicate that this is not the case. Procedures are in place to ensure that the secure quarantining and storage of footage occurs in cases where this is justified under the APH CCTV Code of Practice (the Code).

Clause 5.2 of the Code states that CCTV can be used:

(d) to assist in identifying, apprehending and where appropriate, prosecuting offenders in relation to criminality

(e) to provide evidence upon which to take criminal or civil proceedings.

Under Clause 10 of the Code, quarantining of footage is allowable where it meets the purpose of the Code. Specifically Clause 10.3 enables quarantining for a 90 day period with provision for extensions to this period. We note that an extension of the quarantine period for the footage in question was granted on 28 June 2019 following communications between Cate Saunders (Acting Deputy Secretary, Department of Parliamentary Services) on behalf of the Secretary and Commander David Bacchi (Manager, Protection Operations, AFP).

Consistent with previous advice to Ms Saunders from Commander David Bacchi on 28 June 2019 and advice from Lesa Gale, National Manager Protection Operations, AFP on 12 August 2019, it is our understanding that there is no active criminal investigation in progress in relation to this matter. If this is not the case, I would appreciate your clarification.

I further note that in a response from ACT Police Media to a media enquiry from the Canberra Times on 17 October 2019 which was provided to the DPS Communications Team, ACT Policing stated: On 1 April 2019 AFP received an initial complaint relating to an alleged assault at Parliament House.

ACT Policing Investigators subsequently spake to the complainant who chose not to proceed with making a formal complaint. ACT Policing's investigation has not progressed as a result.

In the event that release of CCTV footage is required as part of any future investigation or legal proceedings or investigation of an offence as outlined in Clause 5.2 of the Code outlined above then the Presiding Officers will immediately respect such a request.

At this time, given our understanding of the current circumstances and status of any relevant inquiry, your request to take possession of a copy of the relevant CCTV footage has not been approved by the Presiding Officers.

However, I wish to assure you that this footage has been copied and stored in a Class B safe and preserved for the reasons you outlined in your submission. Furthermore, in order to enable your access to the footage for the purposes of making assessments regarding the status of any inquiry or investigation, it will be made available for confidential viewing by ACT Policing, with any other party you require at Parliament House. Finally, unless and until a request is made for a copy of the footage for the purposes outlined above. I commit to securely storing the footage on the condition that confirmation is received of the requirement to continue doing so every six months.

While the Code normally places an onus on the requesting officer to seek an extension of the 90 day quarantine period, in respect of this matter, the Presiding Officers have agreed to extend this to 6 months and the Department will write to you before the nominated expiry period seeking your written confirmation of the retention requirement.

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

I refer to my letter to SC Harman dated 3 December 2019 (DPS ref: D19/320493) relating to a request for Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) footage of an incident that occurred in the Australian Parliament House Ministerial Wing on 23 March 2019.

I also refer to an email from Ms Leanne Tunningley, Assistant Secretary, Security Branch to Sgt Sherring on 29 January 2020, in response to a check on the status of the request for CCTV footage on 14 January 2020. Ms Tunningley's response noted that no correspondence had had been received from the Australian Federal Police to my letter of 3 December 2019.

In my letter of 3 December 2019 I wrote, "I commit to securely storing the footage on condition that confirmation is received of the requirement to continue doing so every six months". This was following an agreement by the Presiding Officers to extend the 90 day quarantine period provided for in the Australian Parliament House CCTV Code of Practice (Code). I also indicated that I will write to you before the nominated expiry period seeking your written confirmation of the retention requirement.

The quarantine period expires on 8 May 2020. In accordance with my letter of 3 December 2019, I seek your written confirmation of the retention requirement for a further six months.

In my letter of 3 December 2019, I also sought clarification regarding the status of any inquiry or investigation in progress in relation to this matter. On the basis no response to this question was received, I once again seek your written confirmation regarding the status of any inquiry or investigation in progress in relation to this matter.

I request a written response to the issues raised above by Wednesday 6 May 2020, to ensure the relevant CCTV footage is retained for a further six month period (Monday 9 November 2020). If no response is received before 8 May 2020, the CCTV footage will need to be destroyed in accordance with section 12 of the Code.
