I, Dr Ali Joy, say on oath:

1. I am a medical practitioner and am qualified with the following degrees: MB BChir MA MRCP MRCGP DRCOG DCH.
2. In September 2023, a long standing patient of mine, Amanda Ghost, phoned me and said she was concerned about a medical episode she had experienced in Australia. She said she had experienced similar symptoms before swimming in the ocean in the UK at Cornwall and another time in Spain but nothing like this.
3. She said that the previous evening she had developed shivering and shakes after having swum in cold water at Bondi Beach in Sydney. She said she had swum for approximately 20 minutes and did not feel cold in the water but was extremely cold on leaving the water and shook uncontrollably and could not speak.



4. She said the weather was very cold at the beach with a wind blowing.
5. She said she was helped to the nearby accommodation where she was staying by her co-swimmer Charlotte MacInnes. She said Charlotte had covered her in clothes or blankets at the beach to warm her up and she then took a hot bath. She said that at this point she felt less shaky but had developed welts on her legs and ankles and around her mouth which were itchy and stinging like she had been stung by a jelly fish. She said that the stinging went away after some time but she was left with welts. She said otherwise she felt well. She asked me whether she should go to hospital to have her condition checked.
6. I said I considered that she had experienced the condition known as 'urticaria' and these were urticarial skin changes but they did not require hospital treatment. I explained that the urticaria develops in response to temperature changes like she had experienced getting in and out of the water in the cold at the beach. I said the wind would have produced a chill factor which would have reduced the temperature further.
7. I cannot recall who mentioned the term 'urticaria' first but Amanda was aware of the term when we spoke.
8. I advised Amanda to increase her normal steroid dosage, which she was taking, for 2-3 days until the skin changes settled. Amanda is on a regular low dose of Prednisolone for a rare condition called Samter's triad for which she has regular follow up.
9. Prior to Amanda leaving for Australia, I had known about her long-standing condition called Samter's Triad (which is an over-reaction of the immune system). She had also had a blood test in July 2023 which showed a raised eosinophil white cell count (which can be raised in atopic individuals – i.e. those prone to eczema and inflammation). After Amanda returned to the UK from Australia, we discussed her blood test results and the association between eosinophil levels and urticaria.
