I, Emma Claire Cook of c/- Thomson Geer, Level 28, 1 Eagle Street, Brisbane in the State of Queensland, affirm:

- I am a partner of Messrs Thomson Geer, the solicitors for the Applicant. I was admitted to practice as a solicitor of the Supreme Court of Queensland in 2003. Since that time, I have practised almost exclusively in the area of capital markets, mergers and acquisitions and corporate law. I have been involved in – and led – many recapitalisation campaigns by publicly listed companies and am familiar with the regulatory requirements that must be adhered to in undertaking such a campaign.
- 2 The Applicant, Sunstone Metals Limited ACN 123 184 412 (Sunstone) is an entity admitted to the official list of the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX). It is subject to certain statutory requirements mandated by the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth) (Corporations Act) as it pertains to share issues, as well as to regulatory guidelines issued by the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) and ASX listing rules.
- 3 On Thursday, 15 May 2025, the ASX suspended trading in Sunstone's shares on the ASX at Sunstone's request (**Voluntary Suspension**) in connection with the making of Sunstone's application.

- b. Originating Process;
- c. Proposed minute of order;

- e. a copy of counsel's submissions.
