


Addition to the list of STCA-authorising remaining women and children

- The First Tinkler Affidavit annexed a statement prepared and signed by me on 18 May 2023 (Tinkler Statement) as exhibit MT-1.¹
- 5. At paragraph 10 of the Tinkler Statement, I referred to the 'STCA-authorising remaining women and children' and listed the names of those women and children on whose behalf the Applicant was authorised to issue the legal proceedings.
- Since preparing the Tinkler Statement, the Applicant has subsequently been authorised by subsequently been via audio recording received on WhatsApp on or around 18 August 2023 to add her and her children subsequently and subsequently been
 to the list of STCA-authorising remaining women and children.
- 7. I am instructed that Ms and her children are, or are eligible to be, Australian citizens. Annexed at page 6 of MT-7 is a table containing details of the name, date and place of birth, citizenship status and medical conditions of Ms
- 8. Ms was one of the 12 Australian women with whom I met when I visited AI-Roj camp on 18 June 2022. My visit to AI-Roj camp and interactions with the 12 Australian women are detailed at paragraphs 32-35, 72-74 and 76-78 of the Tinkler Statement.
- 9. On the basis of these interactions, it is my understanding that **Example 1** and her children are being detained unlawfully and inconsistently with international law. I set out the basis for this understanding at paragraphs 41-45 of the Tinkler Statement.
- 10. As described at paragraph 76(2) of the Tinkler Statement, I toured and took images of one of the Australian women's tents. This tent was occupied by Ms **and her children**. I can also confirm that Ms **and her children** was the Australian woman who told me the information at paragraph 76(3) of the Tinkler Statement.

11. In addition to the audio recordings referenced at paragraph 70 of the Tinkler Statement, two audio recordings by Ms were provided at or around the same time. A true transcript of these recordings is annexed at page 9 of MT-8. The recordings are summarised below:



- 12. The Applicant has also been authorised by **Example 18** on 18 August 2023 to add her and her daughter **sector** to the list of STCA-authorising remaining women and children.
- 13. I did not meet Ms during my visit to Al-Roj camp on 18 June 2022, however she has expressed her authority via audio recording received on WhatsApp on or around 18 August 2023 that she is held in Al-Roj camp with her daughter and wishes to be added to the proceeding. Ms also provided WhatsApp messages detailing the significant health problems in Al-Roj camp and suffered by her and her daughter.
- 14. I am instructed that Ms and her daughter are, or are eligible to be, Australian citizens. Annexed at page 7 of MT-7 is a table containing details of the name, date and place of birth, citizenship status and medical conditions of Ms and her daughter.
- 15. I have no reason to believe that the observations made at paragraph 77 of the Tinkler Statement do not apply to the conditions and circumstances faced by Ms and her children, and Ms and her daughter.

Reports regarding the death and subsequent proof of life of Yusuf Zahab

16. At paragraphs 79(2)-79(4) of the Tinkler Statement, I referred to reports received and confirmed by the Applicant that an Australian boy, Yusuf Zahab, was forcibly removed from AI-Roj camp to a male prison at the age of 14 and subsequently killed by an ISIS strike on that prison in or around January 2022. Statement at pages 327-353 are media reports and a statement made by the Applicant confirming this information.

- 17. However, reports have since been brought to my attention that Yusuf Zahab may in fact be alive. This report is based on a video which emerged on or around 1 August 2023, dated 15 September 2022, which was reported in the media. 

An Australian teenager believed killed in an <u>Islamic State</u> airstrike in Syria more than a year ago is believed to have been found alive. His family say they are "overwhelmed with joy".

Yusuf Zahab was just 11 when he was taken into Syria by his family nearly a decade ago: his older brothers were IS fighters and recruiters.

Despite not being accused of any crime, Zahab was imprisoned from the age of 14. He was believed to have been killed by a January 2022 airstrike on al-Sina'a prison by IS fighters, seeking to break jailed insurgents out.

But a video has since emerged of a teenager, aged about 19, believed to be Zahab speaking into a camera. It is believed the video was shot inside a prison in the city of Hasakah in Syria's north-east.

In the video, he identifies himself, names his parents, and gives the date as 15 September 2022. Wearing a T-shirt, he is said to look relatively healthy and uninjured.

While the video is nearly a year old, it appears to confirm Zahab survived the IS attack on the prison where he was being held.

The video has been passed to Australian authorities, and shown to Zahab's family members in Australia. Syrian Democratic Forces have identified the teenager as Zahab. International charity groups are seeking to further confirm his identity.

"We are simply overwhelmed with joy by this news and are so thankful to now have hope again that we will soon be reunited with him.

"Unfortunately, this news follows 12 excruciating months in which numerous sources had indicated that Yusuf had died, and we are very concerned that he is still isolated from his family and stranded in northeast Syria where he remains unsafe.

"Yusuf was just a young boy when he was taken to Syria. We can only begin to imagine the horrors that he has suffered through since then."

Zahab's mother and sister, and his sister's young children, are currently being held in a detention camp in north-east Syria. His brothers, Khaled and IS recruiter Muhammed, were killed in airstrikes.

His family said now that the Australian government had received evidence Yusuf Zahab was alive, they hoped the government would act to bring him home to Australia.

"We also hope that the Australian government will bring the other Australian children home from north-east Syria, especially as some of them are at risk of being separated from their mothers and placed in similar conditions to Yusuf.

"The only way to truly protect all of these children is to bring them and their mothers home to Australia immediately, as the government has previously committed to doing so."

An Australian teenager believed killed in an <u>Islamic State</u> airstrike in Syria more than a year ago is believed to have been found alive. His family say they are "overwhelmed with joy".

Yusuf Zahab was just 11 when he was taken into Syria by his family nearly a decade ago: his older brothers were IS fighters and recruiters.

Despite not being accused of any crime, Zahab was imprisoned from the age of 14. He was believed to have been killed by a January 2022 airstrike on al-Sina'a prison by IS fighters, seeking to break jailed insurgents out.

But a video has since emerged of a teenager, aged about 19, believed to be Zahab speaking into a camera. It is believed the video was shot inside a prison in the city of Hasakah in Syria's north-east.

In the video, he identifies himself, names his parents, and gives the date as 15 September 2022. Wearing a T-shirt, he is said to look relatively healthy and uninjured.

While the video is nearly a year old, it appears to confirm Zahab survived the IS attack on the prison where he was being held.

The video has been passed to Australian authorities, and shown to Zahab's family members in Australia. Syrian Democratic Forces have identified the teenager as Zahab. International charity groups are seeking to further confirm his identity.



1. I am the Chief Executive Officer of the Applicant in this proceeding, and I am authorised to make this affidavit on the Applicant's behalf.



- I have previously provided an affidavit in this proceeding dated 5 June 2023 (the First Tinkler Affidavit).
- 3. In this affidavit I testify about what I was told during my visit to the AI-Roj camp. This visit is covered in detail in the First Tinkler Affidavit. I have no reason to believe that what I was told during my visit to AI-Roj camp was not true and correct.


Addition to the list of STCA-authorising remaining women and children

- The First Tinkler Affidavit annexed a statement prepared and signed by me on 18 May 2023 (Tinkler Statement) as exhibit MT-1.¹
- 5. At paragraph 10 of the Tinkler Statement, I referred to the 'STCA-authorising remaining women and children' and listed the names of those women and children on whose behalf the Applicant was authorised to issue the legal proceedings.
- Since preparing the Tinkler Statement, the Applicant has subsequently been authorised by subsequently been via audio recording received on WhatsApp on or around 18 August 2023 to add her and her children subsequently and subsequently been
 to the list of STCA-authorising remaining women and children.
- 7. I am instructed that Ms and her children are, or are eligible to be, Australian citizens. Annexed at page 6 of MT-7 is a table containing details of the name, date and place of birth, citizenship status and medical conditions of Ms
- 8. Ms was one of the 12 Australian women with whom I met when I visited AI-Roj camp on 18 June 2022. My visit to AI-Roj camp and interactions with the 12 Australian women are detailed at paragraphs 32-35, 72-74 and 76-78 of the Tinkler Statement.
- 9. On the basis of these interactions, it is my understanding that **Example 1** and her children are being detained unlawfully and inconsistently with international law. I set out the basis for this understanding at paragraphs 41-45 of the Tinkler Statement.
- 10. As described at paragraph 76(2) of the Tinkler Statement, I toured and took images of one of the Australian women's tents. This tent was occupied by Ms **and her children**. I can also confirm that Ms **and her children** was the Australian woman who told me the information at paragraph 76(3) of the Tinkler Statement.

11. In addition to the audio recordings referenced at paragraph 70 of the Tinkler Statement, two audio recordings by Ms were provided at or around the same time. A true transcript of these recordings is annexed at page 9 of MT-8. The recordings are summarised below:



- 12. The Applicant has also been authorised by **Example 18** on 18 August 2023 to add her and her daughter **sector** to the list of STCA-authorising remaining women and children.
- 13. I did not meet Ms during my visit to Al-Roj camp on 18 June 2022, however she has expressed her authority via audio recording received on WhatsApp on or around 18 August 2023 that she is held in Al-Roj camp with her daughter and wishes to be added to the proceeding. Ms also provided WhatsApp messages detailing the significant health problems in Al-Roj camp and suffered by her and her daughter.
- 14. I am instructed that Ms and her daughter are, or are eligible to be, Australian citizens. Annexed at page 7 of MT-7 is a table containing details of the name, date and place of birth, citizenship status and medical conditions of Ms and her daughter.
- 15. I have no reason to believe that the observations made at paragraph 77 of the Tinkler Statement do not apply to the conditions and circumstances faced by Ms and her children, and Ms and her daughter.

Reports regarding the death and subsequent proof of life of Yusuf Zahab

16. At paragraphs 79(2)-79(4) of the Tinkler Statement, I referred to reports received and confirmed by the Applicant that an Australian boy, Yusuf Zahab, was forcibly removed from AI-Roj camp to a male prison at the age of 14 and subsequently killed by an ISIS strike on that prison in or around January 2022. This report is based on a video which emerged on or around 1 August 2023, dated 15 September 2022, which was reported in the media. - 18. At the time of affirming this affidavit, I have been unable to verify Yusuf Zahab's location or proof of life following the date on which the video was recorded.


