What is the PNG Centre for Judicial Excellence?

PngCJE was established in 2010 under a memorandum of understanding entered into between the Chief Justice of Papua New Guinea, the Chief Magistrate and the Secretary for the Department of Justice and Attorney General.

Roles and Responsibilities

The PNGCJE is responsible for the delivery of judicial training programs for Judges, Magistrates, Court officers and other officers of Law and Justice Sector (LJS) agencies that play a part in the Court process. The Centre is also responsible for conducting awareness on access to justice, the law, legal rights, and fundamentals of justice.



PNGCJE Objectives

The three key objectives for the establishment of the PNG Centre for Judicial Excellence are to:

- Promote judicial excellence;
- Promote professional development and training; and

• Foster an awareness of judicial administration, developments in the law and social and community issues.
