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I Michael David Bradley of Level 4, 343 George Street NSW affirm:

- 1. I am the solicitor for the Applicant in these proceedings.
- I am authorised to make this affidavit on the Applicant's behalf in relation to his Originating Application dated 5 May 2021.
- 3. I have previously affirmed two other affidavits in these proceedings.
- 4. I am informed by the Applicant and believe that on 8 May 2021 the Applicant conducted searches of the internet and the website Travelocity.com. The Applicant obtained the following search results:
 - (a) There are several flights per day on 10 May 2021, 11 May 2021 and 12 May 2021 from BLR (Bengaluru) to DOH (Doha), either directly or indirectly, most of which are operated by domestic Indian carriers.
 - (b) There are regular scheduled flights on 10 May 2021, 11 May 2021 and 12 May 2021 from India to the Maldives.
- Over yesterday and today I have searched Google Flights and identified that on each of <u>10 May</u> <u>2021</u>, <u>11 May 2021</u> and <u>12 May 2021</u> there are either direct or indirect flights from BLR to DOH. A copy of the search results from today is annexed and marked MB-11.
- Over yesterday and today I have searched Google Flights and identified that on each of <u>10 May</u> <u>2021</u>, <u>11 May 2021</u> and <u>12 May 2021</u> there are either direct or indirect flights from BLR to MLE (Malé, Maldives). A copy of the search results from today is annexed and marked MB-12.

- Over yesterday and today I have searched Google Flights and identified that on each of <u>10 May</u> <u>2021</u>, <u>11 May 2021</u> and <u>12 May 2021</u> there are either direct or indirect flights from BLR to AUH (Abu Dhabi). A copy of the search results from today is annexed and marked MB-13.
- Based upon the following it appears that, notwithstanding the Circular of the Office of the Director of Civil Aviation, Government India dated 30 April 2021 (MB-6 to my affidavit affirmed 5 May 2021), certain international passenger flights have been able to depart India:
 - (a) On Sunday 9 May 2021 Etihad flight EY217, departing BLR, arrived in AUH at 04:17. A screenshot of the AUH International Airport website recording that the flight departed BLR, the actual arrival time in AUH and noting that bags were delivered is annexed and marked MB-14.
 - (b) Also on Sunday 9 May 2021 Qatar Airways flight QTR573 departed BLR at 4:04 and arrived in DOH at 5:45. A screenshot of flightaware.com recording the departure from BLR and arrival in DOH is annexed and marked MB-15.
- I have identified on a non-exhaustive basis the following available flights for the Applicant to travel to Australia:

AirIndia to AUH to Melbourne

- (a) AirIndia flight AI1977 departing BLR on 10 May 2021 at 23:50 and arriving in AUH at 2:10 on 11 May 2021. Screenshots of the AirIndia website displaying available tickets for flight AI1977 and the AUH International Airport website displaying the anticipated arrival of flight AI1977 are annexed and marked MB-16.
- (b) Etihad flight EY460 departing AUH at 00:40 on 12 May 2021 at 00:40 and arriving in MEL (Melbourne) at 19:55 on 12 May 2021. A screenshot of the Etihad airways website displaying available tickets for flight EY470 is annexed and marked MB-17.

Qatar to DOH to Melbourne

- (c) Qatar flight UK0820 operated by Vistara from BLR to DEL (Delhi) departing BLR at 17:45 on 11 May 2021 and connecting Qatar flight QR0579 departing DEL and arriving in DOH at 05:00 on 12 May 2021. A screenshot of the Qatar Airways website displaying available tickets for flight UK0820/QR0579 is annexed and marked MB-18.
- (d) Qatar flight QR0904 departing DOH at 19:25 on 12 May 2021 and arriving at 15:55 in MEL on 13 May 2021. A screenshot of the Qatar Airways website displaying available tickets for flight QR0904 is annexed and marked MB-19.
- 10. I am informed by the Applicant and believe that:
 - (a) he would like to be able to book the flights identified in paragraph 9 above;
 - (b) he has not yet booked the flights identified in paragraph 9 above because
 - (i) he is concerned that the effect of the Determination (as defined in the Originating Application) is that he will be committing an offence if he boards any one of the flights to MEL and attempts to enter Australian territory; and

(ii) he does not want to risk losing the cost of the airfares if he cannot ultimately fly to Australia.

- 1. We refer to your email of 7 May 2021 at 7.27 pm.
- 2. Our position regarding standing applies to both the grounds in issue on Monday.
- 3. It is for your client to establish that he has standing in this proceeding. Your client was plainly mindful of that his evidence and para [7] of his written submissions appear to be directed to that very issue. In federal jurisdiction, that is not a matter that can be put to one side by the parties. It is a matter of which the Court must be satisfied and as to which your client bears the onus.
- 4. Your client's evidence does not establish that he has made (or could make) any practical arrangements to travel to Australia before 15 May 2021, following which time flights from India to Australia will recommence.¹ The prospect of the Determination ever having application to him appears to rest upon a number of significant contingencies, many of which are beyond your client's control and none of which appear likely to come to pass in the short space of time the Determination will continue to operate. As such, and as we intend to submit, his 'interest' in the declarations the subject of prayers 1 and 2 has no evidentiary basis, and so is not a sufficient interest for the purposes of standing. If you take a different view, we would be happy to consider it.
- 5. If your client is not in a position to lead evidence which would overcome the issues we raise above, we expect that our client would be prepared to discuss discontinuance of your client's proceeding with no order as to costs.

Gary Newman v Minister for Health and Aged Care Federal Court Proceedings NSD 388 of 2021

- 1. We refer to your letter of Saturday, 8 May 2021 sent at 2.32pm.
- 2. The fourth paragraph of your letter appears to proceed on the assumption that because our client has not yet made practical arrangements to travel to Australia (ie booked a ticket) he has no standing. We reject that assumption.
- It is clear that the entire purpose of the law was to alter the conduct of people in our client's position to discourage them from even taking those steps. Our client's evidence presently expresses his concern about acting in breach of the Determination (as defined in the Originating Application).
- 4. Moreover, the Determination purports to restrict our client's freedom of travel to Australia, and is therefore a law in respect of which he will have standing to challenge in the absence of booking a ticket. Before he books a ticket, our client is entitled to challenge the legislation to know whether boarding such a flight will result in breaching the law. That accords with principle, and common sense.
- 5. In any event it should be clear from client's present evidence that he has both previously booked travel to Australia (which has been cancelled) and that he now wishes to return to Australia and would be willing to travel by a third country to do so but he is at peril of criminal sanction for doing so. Accordingly, even if we were to accept the premise of your letter, on the current state of our client's evidence he has standing.
- 6. Moreover, we have taken further instructions and made further investigations, and it appears that there are presently flights available out of India to a number of different countries that still

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offer onward flights to Australia. To be clear, in our client's evidence we included reference to a document that purports to restrict flights out of India. It appears that whatever the status of that document as a matter of Indian law it does not have the effect (whether because of exemptions or otherwise) of precluding all flights out of India.

- 7. Accordingly, we are instructed that (1) there are flights available to our client to exit India and to make a connecting flight to Australia; (2) that he would like to book such flights; (3) that our client remains reluctant to book such a flight for fear of breaking the law or losing his money for being unable to travel on the booking.
- 8. It follows that on any view there can be no basis to doubt our client's standing to challenge the validity of the determination.
- 9. Please advise whether your client still wishes to challenge standing and /or the existence of a federal "matter".
- 10. If your client considers that it still wishes to press the issue, then we reserve our right to call further evidence to the above effect.
- 11. We see no prejudice to your client in that course given that we were only notified on Friday night of any concern in respect of standing. In any event, given the wide public importance of the case, we consider it will not preclude the Court from hearing the merits of the matter, and that your client would be constrained by its obligations as a model litigant from objecting to the type of evidence outlined above.

LAURA JAYES:

Well, joining me now live is the Chief Medical Officer, Professor Paul Kelly. Thanks so much for your time. Did you advise the Government to make it illegal for Australians returning home from India over the next two weeks?

PAUL KELLY:

Well, late last week I was asked to provide advice and the Department of Health was asked to provide advice to the Minister in relation to the public health threat, and issues that we had observed over the last few weeks in relation to the number of- numbers and the proportion of positive cases coming into Australia - and that was very much related to people returning from India. And so, even with the other things that we'd developed last week in terms of stopping some of those flights, or delaying them at least, there was still an issue. And so, we were asked to provide public health advice, to inform a decision under the Biosecurity Act - there's a certain section in there, section 477, I think will possibly become a bit famous, that requires the Minister to seek advice, in relation to the proportionality of potential decisions, as well as making sure that they are least restrictive for the least amount of time necessary to deal with an issue of public health threat. And so, that was the advice that we provided.

LAURA JAYES:

Okay. So, the advice that you provided was to make it, essentially, illegal for any Australian citizens returning home from India for about two weeks. Is that correct?

PAUL KELLY:

So, the advice we provided was what we were asked for, which was related to that particular section of the Act, which was the public health threat? What is the nature of that public health threat? What would need- what sort of time would need to decrease that threat? And also, what sort of things could be done to decrease that threat? So, that was what we provided. And then, under the law, there are- once that decisions been made under those emergency powers, in another section of the Act is about the penalty.

LAURA JAYES:

Yeah.

PAUL KELLY:

So, we weren't asked about penalties - that's the law.

LAURA JAYES:

Okay. But, you talk about this S- Section 477 under the Act, which also had notes about five years' jail time or a \$66,000 fine, and you've signed off on it. So, it was your advice?

PAUL KELLY:

So, that's a different section of the Act. Just be very clear. What we were asked for was public health advice, and the nature of the threat, and what could be done about it, and for how long that was needed. That was the advice given. Once the decisions been made, then there are other part of the Act that says: okay...

LAURA JAYES:

Right.

PAUL KELLY:

... if someone breaches those, those elements then there are penalties involved. That's, that's written in there, it's an Act that which was passed by Parliament in 2015, and that's always been there. The fact is that this is the only time-

LAURA JAYES:

[Talks over] Forgive me, Professor. Forgive me, because – so, I just really want to clarify this, because yesterday we heard from Marise Payne, over the weekend we heard from Josh Frydenberg that says this decision to make it illegal for Australians to travel home was the medical advice given. So, are you saying you provided medical advice, and the Government made the decision to make it illegal? Or, was it you?

PAUL KELLY:

I'm an advisor, I don't make decisions of Government.

LAURA JAYES:

Okay. Why so extreme?

PAUL KELLY:

So, I think you played a bit from the Minister for Education, just there, about the level of concern. So, we've seen now 14 breaches of hotel quarantine over the last– since October last year, several since the beginning of the year. Almost all of those have been related to variants of concern, and that has led to various actions, including what's happened in Perth over the weekend. So, this is continuing to be a threat

from overseas and our objective has to remain to keep Australians in Australia safe - that has got to be the fundamental element, and that was what I was asked to give advice upon. So, over the last couple of weeks, as we've seen on one other occasion in the last year, we've seen a very rapid rise in the percentage of positives in our hotel quarantine system, particularly, but not only in Howard Springs in the Territory, and so, action needed to be taken. And so, we were asked what, what was the problem? And what could be done to fix it? And that's, that's the advice we gave.

LAURA JAYES:

So, can hotel quarantine systems only handle 2 per cent of positive cases? Is that correct?

PAUL KELLY:

So, that's the benchmark that we agreed with the states and territories very early on in this pandemic, and it was the advice of the Australian Health Protection Committee at that time - that that would be a benchmark of concern, that we should take action once we got to that level. And in Howard Springs at the moment, it's over 15 per cent of which 70 per cent– over 70 per cent of them are people that have arrived back from India. So, I think you can get a sense that- where the issue was and why action needed to be taken. We need to make our quarantine systems as safe as they can. And in particular, in the Northern Territory, they do have limitations in their healthcare for Territorians. I've worked in Darwin, and I- there is- that hospital, the Royal Darwin Hospital is almost always full. And so, we need to take those things into account as well.

LAURA JAYES:

Just one final question, what responsibility do you have to those 9000 Australians in India who are at great risk of contracting COVID?

PAUL KELLY:

So of course, this is a- has been a very difficult decision of Government to make this decision, particularly for those 9000 Australians that are in India - and my heart, my heart definitely goes out to them and to their families that are here as well. Just to very much stress this is a two-week pause, there will be a lot of work that's done in that two weeks to make sure that we can resume getting Australians home from India, and that's, that's a really important component of this, and why that two weeks was necessary. But, we need to, need to get them home.

LAURA JAYES:

[Talks over] So, the Government says that will just be reviewed in two weeks. Are you guaranteeing that that will change? Your advice will be that that will be lifted in two weeks so those Australians don't remain stranded?

PAUL KELLY:

So, we'll continue to give advice based on the information that we have and the data that we're, we're collecting, not only here but also in India, in relation to the pandemic there and the- and different ways that we can look at decreasing the number of positive cases coming home from India - and so, we'll continue to do that. The actual instrument under the Biosecurity Act, which was signed on Friday night, is, is for a two-week period - it stops on the 15th.

LAURA JAYES:

Alright.

PAUL KELLY:

So, that may need- if it needs to be continued, that'll be a whole different process.
